## The Devastating Effects of HIV/AIDS in Africa

- 74% of people living HIV/AIDS live in Africa.
- A total of about 25 million people in the world have been killed by the disease.
- 80% of AIDS orphans are in Africa .
- only 3% of the orphans receive any kind of support.

## The Impact of HIV/AIDS on Children

- The loss of a parent to AIDS has serious consequences on a child's access to basic necessities such as shelter, food, clothing, health and education.
- Traditional family support mechanisms have eroded due to increased demand
- As a result, there has been a rise in numbers of child-headed households, child care-givers as well as elderly care-givers.
- Orphans in general are over worked, sexually exploited and drop out of school.
- Elderly women and girls are the worst affected

## Africa's Response to the Pandemic

African Governments have:

- Increased behavioral surveillance in tracking progression of the pandemic.
- Expanded Voluntary Counseling and Testing Centers (VCTs) throughout the region.

- Developed community care and support programs for orphans and vulnerable children.

## Our Work Program in 2008

- 1. Provide Home-based Care Such as:**
  - Feeding and clothing.
  - Counseling single parents dying from AIDS.
  - Having someone carryout house-hold chores.
  - Counseling the children.
  - Administering AIDS drugs.
- 2. Support Institutional Care-Providers by:**
  - Supporting the daily feeding of orphans.
  - Supplying clothing including school uniforms.
  - Providing school fees and school materials.
  - Administering drugs to those who need them.
- 3. Provide School-based Assistance by:**
  - Supporting the feeding programmes.
  - Assisting with school fees and materials.
  - Proving school uniforms.
  - Offering supportive counseling and tutoring.
- 4. Strengthen the Capacity of Community-based Organizations (CBOs) by providing:**
  - Skills training on Home-based care.
  - Skills training on institutional care-giving.
  - Skills training on provision of school-related support to orphans.
